How do I read a climate Graph?

- 1. Look at the title first. It tells you where the information was gathered.
- 2. The X axis (the horizontal line at the bottom of the graph) is labeled and shows the moths of the year plus the number of precipitation days for each month.
- 3. The Y axis (the vertical line on the left side of the graph) is labeled and shows the average temperature of each month. Note that 0 Celsius is not at the bottom of the axis.
- 4. Look at the second Y axis (the vertical line at the right side of the graph). It shows the average precipitation for the month.
- 5. On some climate graphs, you may see Green Fill. This indicates the months during which growing season occurs.
- The Red Line is the average monthly temperature. Read the axis on the left of the graph.
- 7. The Blue Bars are the average monthly precipitation. Read the axis on the right of the graph.
